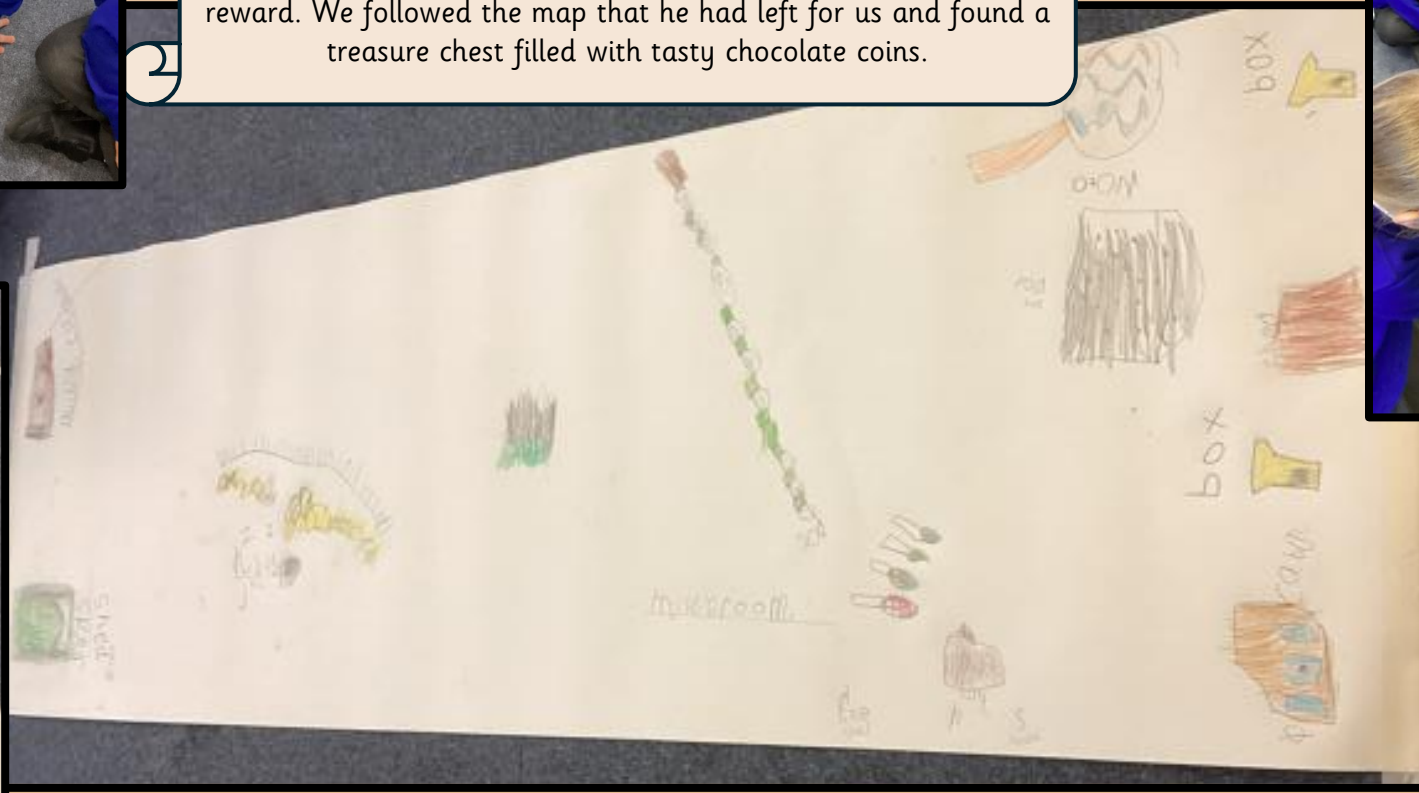
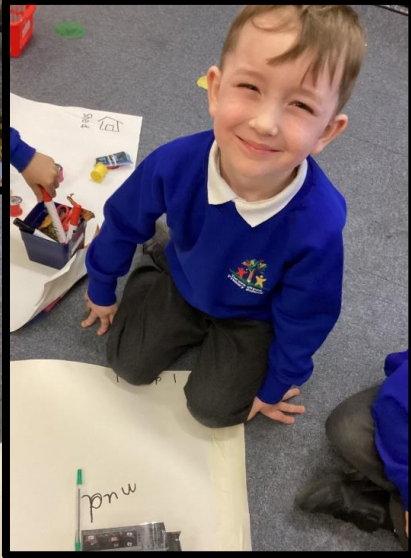




# Pirates

# Space



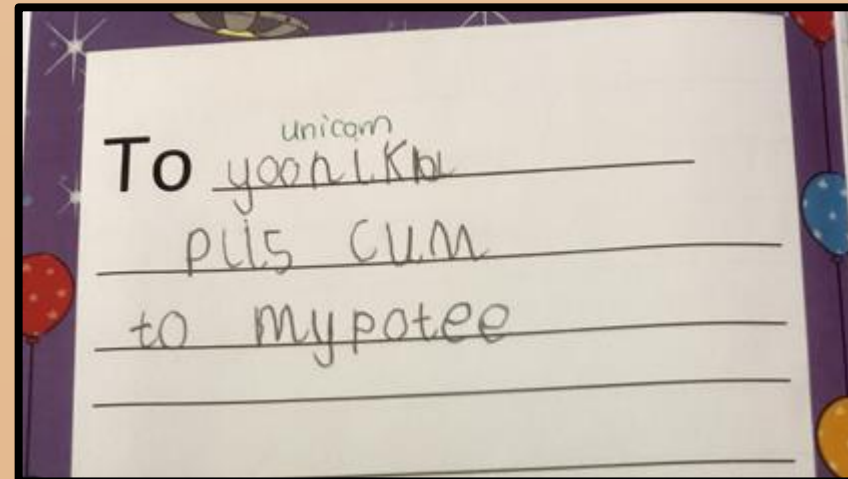
We have been very busy learning all about space!

We were very surprised when we found a video of a spaceship landing in our outdoor area. We decided to go outside to investigate and found an alien egg on top of our hill!

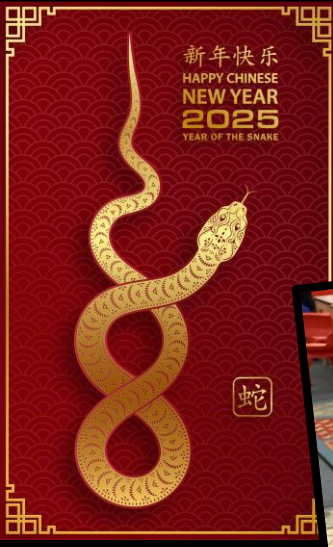
We took the egg back to the classroom and when we opened it, we found an alien called Q Pootle 5, along with a story about how he had landed on Earth.

# World Book Day

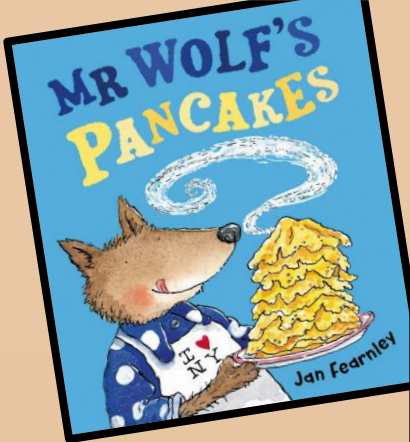
We loved dressing as our favourite story characters and sharing our favourite stories for World Book Day!

We had lots of fun activities to choose from such as making elephant suncatchers, magic wands and designing jackets.





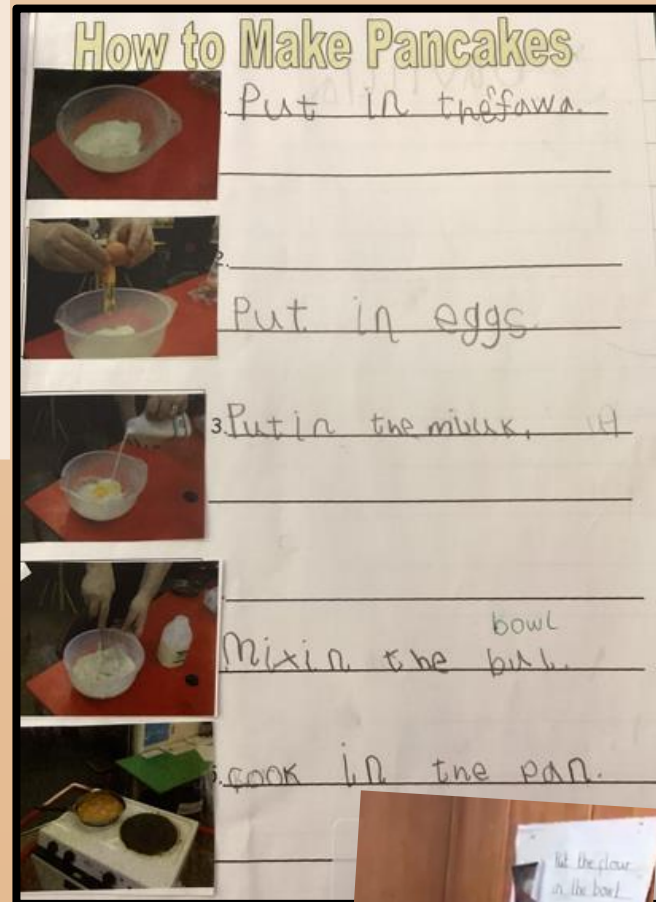


# Pancake Day

# Supertato

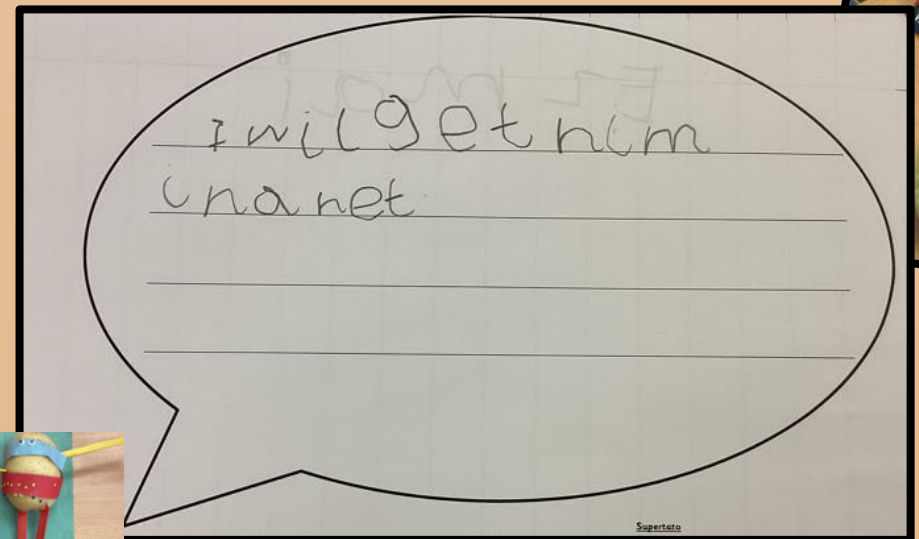
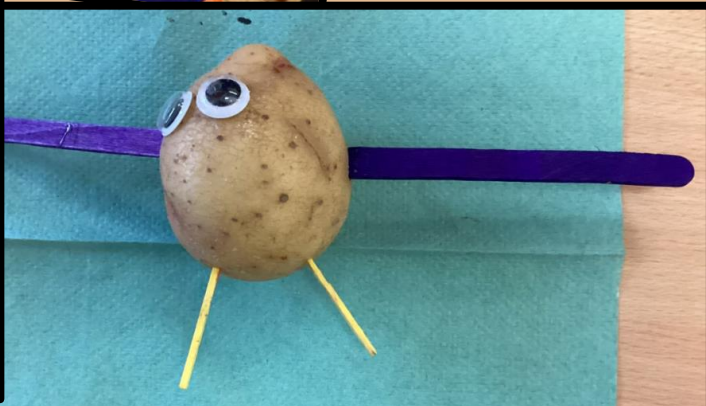


We have really enjoyed learning the story 'Supertato' this term. We made our own super vegetables to help Supertato to defeat the Evil Pea.

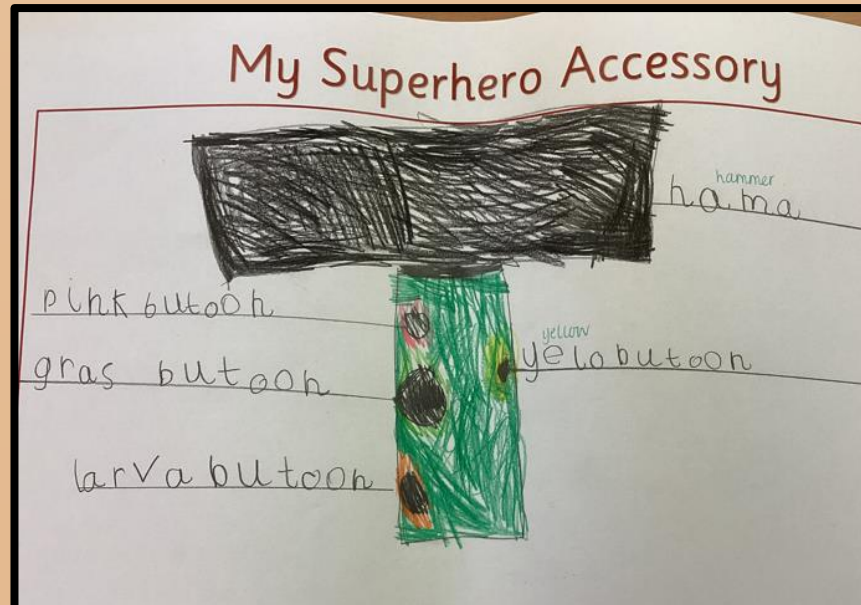
# Superheroes

# Teddy Bear Hospital

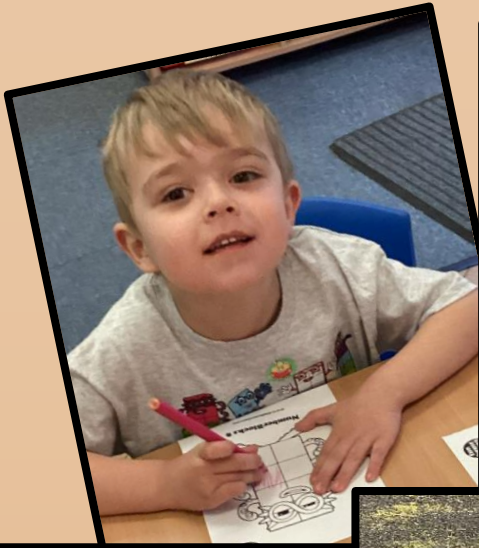

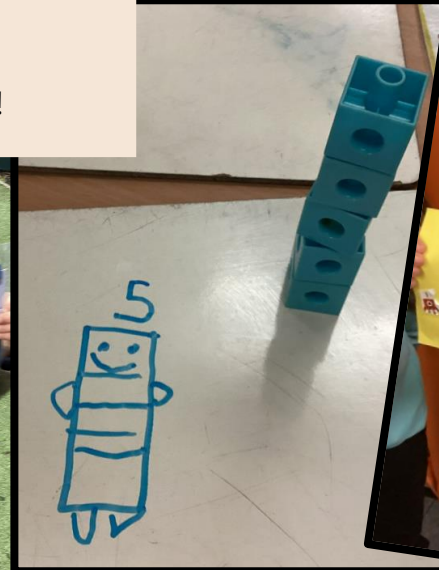


# Numberblocks Day

# Paddington's Postcards

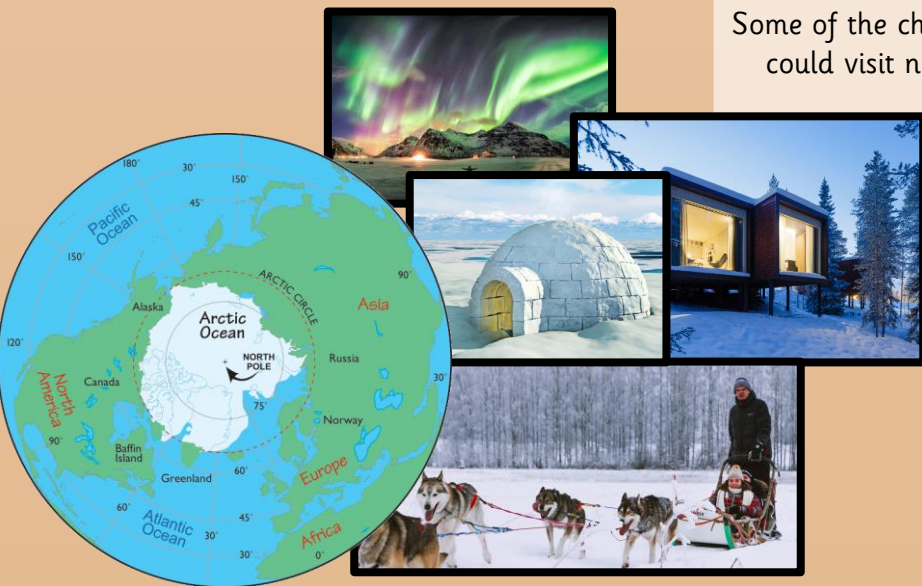


This term, we have started to receive postcards from Paddington. Paddington has been telling us all about his adventures and different places that he has visited around the world.
