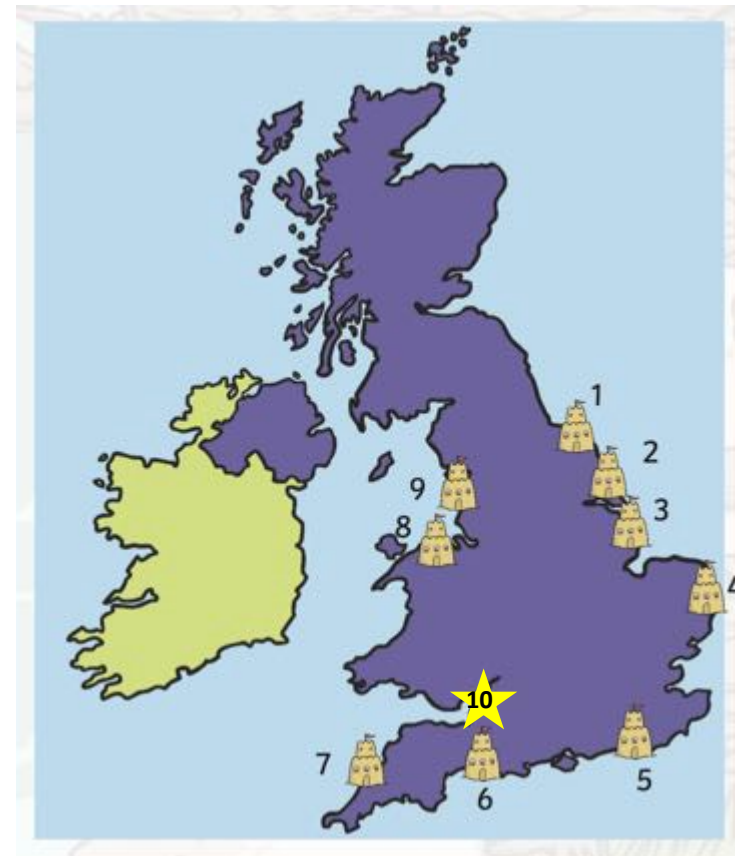

1910

Most people went to the seaside for the day on a steam train. People wore posh clothes. People thought it was rude to show their body parts and women had to get changed in wooden bathing machines that were pushed into the sea.

1960

Thanks to the Holiday Pay Act 1938 people got paid annual leave and could afford to go on holiday for a week or more. Many stayed in holiday camps where there was onsite entertainment. People wrote bathing suits and wanted to get a tan.

2020

Today many people go on seaside holidays in the UK. People stay in holiday parks or hotels. Lots of people decide to holiday around the world to enjoy warmer weather and to experience different cultures.
