Inclusion Corner

Some children may require special educational provision because they have a disability which prevents or hinders them from making use of the educational facilities generally provided. These difficulties can be age related and may fluctuate over time, for example Glue Ear. Children with a vision impairment (VI), hearing impairment (HI), Physical Disability (PD) or a multi-sensory impairment (MSI) may require specialist support and/or equipment to access their learning.

As a Fully Accessible Mainstream School, we have a Physiotherapy room, personal care and hoisting facilities and the use of a lift. We work with agencies such as the Sensory Support Service (SSS) to ensure our adaptations ensure accessibility.

We also complete sensory audits of our environment to support sensory differences.


Parent Governors:
