<u>Studybugs</u>

Last week, we launched Studybugs, a new, more efficient and secure system for reporting your child's absences due to illness. Online reporting will stop parents needing to call through to the school office, which sometimes can take a while due to busy phonelines. It will also ensure Arbor accurately reflects reasons for illness. Please download the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school. Does your child know what the CEOP button does and where to find it on our school website?



Composer of the week



John Rutter (1945-present day):

At this time of year especially, church choirs around the country will be preparing for carol services - many will have chosen some classic carols with the modern twist of John Rutter.

He came to know music early on in his life serving as a chorister during his school days. He is an internationally-recognized composer and conductor who has traveled the world appearing with top ensembles. Though known primarily for his choral works, he has also composed music for orchestra and instrumental ensembles, children's opera, and even music for television! After serving as the Director of Music at Clare College in the 1970s, Rutter went on to found a popular chamber choir known as the Cambridge Singers.


