

Composer of the week

Percy Grainger (1882-1961):



Born in Australia, Percy Grainger grew up taking piano lessons from his mother and then later attended conservatory. He spent most of his adult life in America and Europe composing, conducting, and collecting English folk tunes. His good friend and fellow composer Edvard Grieg encouraged him to use wax-cylinder phonographs to record his folk tune collection, making him the first to do such a thing. Grainger was known to be quite eccentric. It is said that he carried his favourite piano stool around in a wheelbarrow and dressed in his own, unique way.





One Page Profiles

A One Page Profile (OPP) is a summary of what is important to and for a child.


What is important to a person includes only what people are "saying":

- with their words
- with their behaviour

When words and behaviour are in conflict, listen to the behaviour.

What is important for people, includes only those things that need to be present in a person's life for them to be:

- healthy, safe and achieve.
- What others see as important to help the person to be a valued member of their community



We use OPPs in school to share important information with adults who work with the child, for example, supply teachers. The OPPs state details that are essential adults know so that the child can be 'healthy, safe and achieve'.

Not every child needs a OPP. Not every child with a Special Educational Need requires a OPP. Sometimes children not on the SEND register require a OPP, for example, if they have English as an Additional Language or a friendship need.

OPPs are jointly created with the child, families, school staff and, if appropriate, outside agencies and also use information gained through assessments and reports. If you are sent a OPP Forms to complete, please include any information you can to help us gain a rounded picture of your child. The Forms will need completing by next Friday (June 20th).
