Our school uniform colour is a combination of a royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan, and grey/black trousers/shorts or skirt. Most items can be bought from High Street shops and supermarkets. Items marked with a \* below can be bought with the school logo on if preferred. Uniform with logos on can be purchased from Kids Essentials in Northfield.

Our school uniform is gender neutral and consists of the following:

### UNIFORM

Plain white polo shirt.

Grey or black skirt / pinafore dress / shorts / trousers (*not jogging bottoms*)

Please note skirts and tailored shorts should be a minimum of knee length and of a style which allows children to sit comfortably on the floor. Three-quarter, calf-length and full-length leggings should not be worn.

Blue & white checked or striped summer dresses

Royal blue sweatshirt\* or cardigan\*, *without a hood*, either plain or with the school logo

Plain white / black socks

Black, navy or grey tights

Shoes should be flat, black and appropriate for school, *not trainers*.

Your child should wear shoes which he or she can manage to do up independently. Please do not send your child to school in shoes which prevent them from running in the playground. If boots are worn these also should be plain black.

Head scarfs must be black, white or navy and plain (no patterns or sparkles)

Of course, with the cost-of-living crisis ever present, please do not feel you MUST replace any uniform until it is needed, however the expectation from September 2026 will be REGULATION SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR ALL.

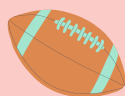

## Composer of the week

### **Erik Satie (1866-1925):**

Erik Satie was a French musician born in 1866. He didn't just write music—he also wrote articles for magazines like *Vanity Fair*. His music was very different for the time and sounds simple compared to today's music. Some of his pieces even used instruments that sounded like animals or other funny noises!



When he was 13, he went to an important music school in Paris, but his teachers thought he was lazy and not very good at playing the piano. He never finished school. Instead, he played music in small cafés and cabarets because most people didn't like his style at first.

Later, he became friends with famous composers Maurice Ravel and Claude Debussy. They helped people notice his music. Erik Satie died in 1925, but today he's remembered as someone who changed music forever.

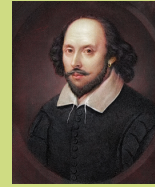
