

Ravi Shankar was an Indian sitarist and composer. A sitar virtuoso, he became the world's best-known expert of Indian classical music in the second half of the 20th century, and influenced many musicians in India and throughout the world, including George Harrison from the Beatles and Zakir Hussain. Shankar was awarded India's highest civilian honour, the Bharat Ratna, in 1999.
