This includes the protected characteristics as outlined in the 2010 Equality Act (gender, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex and sexual orientation). This is an important part of our school ethos.

On Thursday this week, we were visited by Andy Moffat MBE, who is the creator of the No Outsiders Programme and who was one of the finalists for the Varkey Foundation Global Teacher Prize in 2019. 

Composer of the week



Our composer of the week is: Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750)

Johann Sebastian Bach was born in Eisenach, Germany, where his father was a town musician. Bach came from a long line of composers – over 300 years' worth of Bachs all worked as professional musicians. By the time Johann was 10, both his parents had died, so he was brought up by his older brother, who was a church organist. Johann became a very good organist, too.

During his lifetime, people thought of Bach as just an ordinary working musician. No one really knew much about his music until 100 years after his death, when another composer, Felix Mendelssohn, conducted a performance of Bach's St. Matthew Passion.

Bach is now seen as one of the greatest geniuses in music history. He wrote all kinds of music – for organ and other keyboard instruments, orchestras, choirs, and concertos for many different instrumental combinations.

Mozart, Beethoven, Paul Simon, Art Garfunkel, Chopin, Florence Price, Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, Stevland Hardaway Morris, Toumani Diabaté, Quincy Delight Jones Jr, Isaac Albéniz, Glenn Miller and Piotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky

Inclusion Corner Attendance and Anxiety

We all know being in school everyday, on time, is vital for our children to achieve their full potential, and this is even more true for children who have a Special Educational Need and/ or disability.


Some children with SEND may experience additional anxiety around attending school (children without SEND can experience anxiety too!). Children who are neuro-diverse may become anxious due to not understanding social expectations, whilst children with a learning need may become anxious when they know an assessment is due.

As parents, we may want to protect our children from this unpleasant feeling by keeping them with us at home, however this just reaffirms that the child has a reason to be anxious.
