We read and discuss the poem 'Caged Bird' by Maya Angelou before writing our own versions about an animal of our choice.

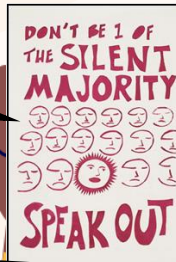
A trapped elephant
